The World Around is a non-profit institution founded in 2020 with the goal of enriching and empowering architectural discourse. Through a robust series of international events and broadcasts, the platform seeks to connect and create a diverse and global network of thinkers and makers today.

Collaborative in spirit and global in scope, we have four pillars of practice: our fast-paced and cutting-edge all-day Summit in New York City created to convene and champion the now, near and next of architecture; our In Focus programs that travel to new cities presenting curated talks on specific themes; our online archive of live broadcasts, interviews and presentations; and our new Young Climate Prize mentorship program for under-25s.

In close to five years, we have covered the work of designers from over 150 world cities, each of them sharing visionary work on topics that range from the ecological crisis to social and racial justice, from landscape design and food scarcity to homelessness, from video game design and artificial intelligence to spoken word and literature. Working closely with our growing network of international partners that includes New York's Guggenheim Museum, Rotterdam's Nieuwe Instituut, London's Design Museum, and our global cultural partner the Fondation Cartier pour l'art contemporain.

WELCOME

Design is unavoidably and thrillingly connected to the future. It is one of the ways we manifest change, be it through new objects and technologies or new strategic thinking. As such, it is an interface with tomorrow. The Design Museum has always been an institution striving to reflect such change, but only recently has it become one able to proactively drive it.

Future Observatory, the Design Museum's national research programme for the green transition, funds and champions design research. Funded by the Arts and Humanities Research Council, it will support more than 100 research projects across the spectrum of design, from fashion to architecture. That is millions of pounds invested in a new generation of researchers seeking to lower carbon emissions, reduce waste and promote regenerative forms of practice. In that sense, Future Observatory is redefining what a museum can be and repositioning the Design Museum as a catalyst.

The theme of this collaboration with The World Around is 'Research' because we believe not just in the power of research but in its necessity. The decade ahead is no ordinary decade—we are at the tipping point of planetary warming the consequences of which we do not even fully grasp, and anyone can see that business as usual is failing us. Research is crucial to challenging those default systems. But what kind of research do we mean? Research that proposes alternative models, materials, narratives. Research that can demonstrate that other ways exist. Research that can challenge the de-futuring of the next generation's prospects. Research as activism. All of our speakers have developed research as a practice that reshapes their disciplines and, possibly, the future.

Launched in November 2021, Future Observatory is coordinated by the Design Museum in partnership with the Arts and Humanities Research Council (AHRC), which is part of UK Research and Innovation (UKRI). As a cultural institution, the Design Museum is ideally placed to bring cutting-edge design research to broad audiences, making it accessible and engaging and enabling it to have a greater impact. Indeed, Future Observatory redefines what a museum can be: a place not solely focused on the past or the present but one that can help shape the future. Acting as both a coordinating hub for a nationwide programme, as well as a research department within the museum, Future Observatory curates exhibitions, programmes events and funds and publishes new research, all with the aim of championing new design thinking on environmental issues.



HENK OVINK DARE TO COMPREHEND THE ALTERNATIVE, BY DESIGN



Feifei Zhou is a Chinese-born artist and architect, whose work explores spatial, cultural, and ecological impacts of the industrialized built environment. With Anna Tsing, Jennifer Deger and Alder Keleman Saxena, Zhou co-edited Feral Atlas: The More-than-Human Anthropocene, an online interactive platform for scientific research into, and research dissemination about, feral species and feral dynamics in the Anthropocene.

Natsai Audrey Chieza is a designer and the founder of Faber Futures: a multi-disciplinary practice advocating the use of advanced biological technologies in response to urgent global challenges. Learning from non-human life forms, Chieza's work ranges from experimenting with bacterial dyes to reduce water waste in textile production, to structuring and envisioning policies towards sustainable, resilient bioeconomies driven by technology.

Cher Potter is Curatorial Director of Future Observatory, the Design Museum's national research programme for the green transition. Previously, she was Senior Research Fellow in 'Design Futures' at the Victoria and Albert Museum, investigating emerging design responses to large-scale social and environmental change (2013–2021) and ran the Creative Direction at WGSN trend forecasting bureau (2008–2013).

SAMMY BALOJI IN CONVERSATION



Sammy Baloji is an artist whose work explores the memory and history of the Democratic Republic of Congo. Born and raised in the contested, mineral-rich Katanga province of the DRC, Baloji's practice forms an ongoing research project into the cultural, architectural and industrial heritage of the region, studying the enduring impacts of Belgian colonization.



ADRIAN LAHOUD SECOND SEA



Adrian Lahoud is an architect, urban designer and researcher, and Dean of the School of Architecture at the Royal College of Art (RCA) in London. Responding to a need for a planetary-scale response to the climate crisis, his project The Second Sea is an online platform that calculates the damages proportionately owed by the world's nations to coastal cities at risk from rising sea levels.



JULIA KING DESIGN AS RESEARCH




Dr Julia King is an architect, teacher and urban researcher. Her design-driven practice studies the impacts of the urbanizing world and its impact on marginalized communities. From analyzing the impacts of mass-migration on UK high streets to codesigning sanitation systems for urban settlements in New Delhi, King's research aims to understand cultural and institutional relationships in areas of dense development, to collaboratively design and build sitebased interventions. Eyal Weizman is a Professor of Spatial and Visual Cultures at Goldsmiths, University of London, and the founding director of Forensic Architecture.

Since 2010, Weizman has led the award-winning agency comprising architects, scientists, computer programmers, video editors, and lawyers to investigate human rights violations around the world. Weizman is a member of the Technology Advisory Board of the International Criminal Court and of the Centre for Investigative Journalism.



The Design Museum is the world's leading museum devoted to contemporary architecture and design. Its work encompasses all elements of design, including fashion, product and graphic design. Since it opened its doors in 1989 the museum has displayed everything from an AK-47 to high heels designed by Christian Louboutin. It has staged over 100 exhibitions, welcomed over seven million visitors and showcased the work of some of the world's most celebrated designers and architects including Paul Smith, Zaha Hadid, Jonathan Ive, Frank Gehry, Eileen Gray, Dieter Rams, Margaret Calvert and Yinka Ilori.

On 24 November 2016, the Design Museum relocated to Kensington, west London.
